We stopped first at the Gilmore Garage Works program and saw the Ford Bronco the High Schoolers built and will raffle off for a fundraiser. Then it was off to the Otsego Historical Society to see their Museum including a new display of cookbooks dating back to the early 1900's. Lunch in Allegan was next with multiple options for food. Due to one restaurant being busy many members overtook the bar area. After lunch, a tour of the Allegan County Jail put a few of us behind bars. Then a short jaunt along Lake Allegan to the Allegan Dam to watch some fisherman have decent success although the sign on the shore advised not to eat the fish. Finally we were off to Dinner at Aubree's in Plainwell where Pat Mehl gave a short but captivating presentation on the automotive history of Kalamazoo.

After heavy rain Friday night, the cars and roads were a little damp Saturday but that did not deter the 8 cars and 17 people that stayed the night as we left Kalamazoo. We headed south this time and our first stop at Dr. Nathan Thomas's house. This was preserved as a stop on the Underground Railroad. We got to see into the attic where slaves headed towards freedom in Canada were hidden, and walked on the same floors they did, while enjoying some of the best donuts in Michigan. Our second stop was Vicksburg Historical Village where the staff used us as their warm-up for the season as we were given tours of a repair garage, a one-room schoolhouse, a family dwelling, sweet shop, and a general store. Lunch was held at Yoder's Country Market in Centreville where everyone ate a little too much after a short photo opportunity at the Langley Covered Bridge.



After lunch, we drove to Rawson's King Mill for a tour of the mill. Sadly our curator did not show, but we still had a great time enjoying the beautiful scenery on the St. Joseph River at our leisure. On our way back to Kalamazoo we stopped for Ashby's Ice Cream at an old Malt Shoppe in Scotts called Scooters, which is housed in an old hardware store and decorated with lots of antiques. Our final stop was at a private car collection in Galesburg called GoGo Classic Cars. The day ended at the Tap House in Kalamazoo, which shares floor space with a large Motorsports store, where we watched a storm roll in as we waited for the Preakness to begin.

A great time was had by all as we traveled more than 150 miles over 2 days around a part of the state we have not seen much of as a club. A special thanks goes out to our tour leader Pat Mehl for all the planning and to Bill Anderson for helping put together nice map/direction packets that made navigation a breeze.
