## Dust -Off Tour slated for Saturday, May 20, 2017

This year's LMR Dust-Off Tour will mark a milestone for club members as they will be the first auto club to tour the 135 year old Durant-Dort Head-quarter Building and Factory One recently renovated by General Motors.

Since purchasing the Durant-Dort Carriage Factory in 2013, General Motors has spent over \$3 million to make it an archives and research center with meeting rooms and a wing to house classic vehicles and carriage artifacts.

"Housing these collections at Factory One provides greater accessibility to the public, history enthusiasts and educational institutions, making the amazing shared history of GM, Kettering and the automotive industry in Flint available to new generations," said Kettering University President Dr. Robert K. McMahan.

Directions: Tour members who trailer a vehicle will park north of the old Sarvis Building by the Sloan Museum and leave the parking lot at 9:30 a.m. to turn right onto Kearsley St., traveling west through the University of Michigan and downtown Flint until reaching the traffic light at Grand Traverse St. Turn right and take the second street, Water St. The building is 316 Water St. The tour begins at 10 a.m., lunch at noon, a short meeting follows and then the Factory One tour.



The Durant-Dort Factory One Building began as a cotton and woolen company in 1880. It was leased to William Crapo Durant and Josiah Dallas Dort in 1886 to first build carriage carts, then automobiles. In 1908, Durant founded General Motors Company to build Buicks and later Chevrolets.
