He encourages members to bring their children, grandchildren and great grandchildren to this year's club picnic that will take place after a 45 minute ride from the Ingham County Fairgrounds to Eaton Rapids, one of the few small cities in the United States to have its downtown area located on an island in the Grand River. There are four bridges and three foot bridges leading into the quaint downtown area. Back in the old days, 16 daily trains would stop in the town nicknamed "Saratoga of the West" to enjoy the health benefits of the artisan wells located there.

Just outside of the city is the 16 acre mansion of Irving and Janet Reuter. Reuter was the general manager and president of Oldsmobile from 1925 -1935. It is now a four star elegant bed and breakfast that hosts many weddings and dinner parties. Tourists can visit the facility and grounds as well as enjoy fine dining in the pub and restaurant.

After touring the area and visiting the shops in Eaton Rapids, the picnic will be held at Mason's Laylin Park, which is a 7 acre park with ponds stocked with fish. There is a catch and release program in effect but everyone is encouraged to bring a pole and try their luck. There will be prizes for the oldest car, longest commute and largest contingent from one family.

Perhaps allowing the next generation mechanics/hobbyists an opportunity to spend a day or two, now and then, with the veterans, disassembling and assembling part of a car. Perhaps explaining how to debug a carburetor or service brakes or resolve ignition problems or even explain why wheels need to be balanced are good teachable moments.

> And then there are the teachable moments that involve the functions of our club. Perhaps we need to do

a bit of training on how to conduct a tour, how to schedule events, and how to create supporting documents, and track and budget finances.

All these tasks seem easy and obvious for some folks, but the information and knowledge needs to be passed on to your successor club members.

Let's continue these thoughts between meetings by calling or meeting with a fellow club member or two to discuss how we can make these things happen. Then, as we progress, we will have the next generation of members on board.

There needs to be a succession plan! Think about it as you volunteer for an officer position for 2017. It's time for nominations! Step up! It's not too late!
