Day long Mothball Tour impresses club members

They departed from the Port Huron Comfort Inn in 11 vintage Chevrolets and headed to their first stop at the Terry & Rita Earnest Car Collection. Despite the threat of rain, they were able to see 18 rare exotic vintage automobiles including the newest edition, a 1913 Pierce Arrow Touring car that the owner purchased just the week before at the Hershey International Auto Show.

Other impressive vehicles that the group saw included an Auburn made by the Packard Car Company as well as Pierce Arrows and military jeeps. The collection of memorabilia also was impressive.

An hour later, they were on their way to the Algonac Maritime Museum, which is the home of the power boat line known as Chris Craft built by Christopher Columbus Smith and his brother Hank. There, club members viewed many wooden boats including the Gar Wood, nautical artifacts, vintage outboard boat motors and other memorabilia.

At noon, the LMR Board meeting was held at the museum followed by a membership meeting.

Ready to enjoy dinner at the Voyager Res-

taurant, the group ran into a real storm with sheets of rain and hail and even snow as they headed for the restaurant. But in true Chevy fashion, they pressed on and later enjoyed a great meal of their choice.

As the dinner ended, the weather cleared and the 24 remaining members said their good-bys and headed home.
