

## **Bob Sovis and His Impact**

The history of the Lower Michigan Region of the VCCA is built upon the shoulders of legends in the antique car history including but not limited to; Lew & Norma Clark, Carlton & Wini Crawford, Darrell & Hope Dowdy, Clyde & Ruby Hale, Paul & Rosie Hammond and Pinky & Joyce Randall, but at a local level I am not sure any of those names stand as tall as Bob Sovis.



Bob's history started long before the formation of the VCCA but he was destined to help bolster it. Bob was born in Flint Michigan in 1935 so his home was Chevrolet's home! His father worked for Chevrolet for 42 years in total. In 1944, Bob and his family loaded all their belongings into a homemade trailer pulled behind the family's 1933 Chevrolet Eagle and

moved to New Lothrop, where Bob's Uncle owned a repair garage. Bob's dad would work at the garage and Bob would tag along. In 1952, Bob's uncle brought home a wrecked 1950 Fleetline and this would become Bob's first Chevrolet. Bob got the car in March, he made it his goal to have it on the road by prom in May. Well, the morning of prom rolled around and the car was not done. But while Bob was at work at the local supermarket, his dad and uncle finished the car and surprised Bob with it at work. After that 1950, Bob would restore a couple Oldsmobiles (his uncle would become an Oldsmobile sub-dealer), A 1952 & a 1953 Bel Air.

In 1956, Bob graduated from General Motors Institute (now, Kettering University) and started working for GM Parts Division. In 1965, Bob would meet Pinky Randall and joined the VCCA and the Lower Michigan Region in April of 1965, just 4 months after the LMR was founded. Always a go-getter, Bob quickly took to the club, serving as a member of the Board in 1965 and by 1967 served as the region's 4rd Director.

In 1967, the Lower Michigan Region hosted the 4th annual Central Meet in Flint and Bob Sovis played a huge role in making the meet a success. The Sloan Museum of

Discovery (Sloan Panorama of Transportation, as it was called at the time) had just opened the year prior and played host to the car show. As Bob was an employee of Chevrolet, he had been working since he joined the VCCA to get the auto manufacturer to give support to the club. That all culminated at the 4th Central Meet with Chevrolet providing the awards for the meet as well as donating 2 important cars to the Sloan Panorama of Transpiration. Just before the meet, Chevrolet donated a 1915 Baby Grand as well as GM's 100 Millionth U.S. Built vehicle in a 1967 Caprice.

Bob Sovis would stay very active in the VCCA for the next 57 years until his passing. During that time he would hold many different positions in the LMR

including membership secretary and awards chairman for many many years. He would serve as meet co-chair (along with Pinky Randall) for the VCCA's 15th Anniversary Meet in Colorado Springs in 1976, and chair the 24th Central Meet, once again held in Bob's home town of Flint.

Throughout the years, Bob would own many cars and they were all General Motors vehicles. Of particular importance was a 1947 Fleetmaster Convertible that Bob's late son, Ron, bought. Bob and Ron were restoring the car when tragedy struck and Ron passed away. Years later, Bob restored the car in the color Ron picked out. The car is proudly displayed at the Sloan Museum along with a 1939 Chevrolet that was owned by Bob for many years. He also sent his 1973 GMC

Motorhome and Chevette to the North American

Motorhome & 1986 Diesel Chevette to the North American Auto & Truck Museum.

Bob's biggest impact was not through the Chevrolet club but through his love of History, Flint and Chevrolets. His personal mission was to keep Flint tied tightly to its Ron Sovis's 1947 Chevrolet, now apart of the Chevrolet roots. He is most well known for starting the Flint Auto Fair, which raises money to support the

acquisition and maintenance of the automobile collection at the Sloan Museum. Each year the Auto Fair brings at least 800 cars to the Flint Cultural Center no matter the weather. Bob also served on the Board of Directors for Flint's Back to the Bricks since its inception.

Bob, himself, admitted to be a "purist" and that led him to starting yet another car show, Bob and his Family at the Donation of his

also held at the Sloan Museum, called Golden Memories. He developed the show specifically to celebrate automobiles 50

> years or older in original or as-original condition and is extremely popular among other purists in the area.



Bob's impact on Flint and the antique car hobby is appreciated and his spirit will live on with those that knew him and those that were affected by him whether they knew him or not!
